#### SYNOPSIS

Yangzi and Murph have been living in New York City for years, but as their time there came to an end, so were their friendship.

Five years later, one November, in an introverted town of Eastern China, Yangzi visits Murph in her apartment, carrying with him a new novel he had wrote - a story about a wandering man investigating NYC's hidden secrets. Night falls as they read the story, yet the text seems to be morphing as it is being told. At night, they take a stroll around town, crossing the eerily quiet streets, as if the uncertainty from the story is still lingering.


In March, Murph met a strange girl, who also took an interest in Yangzi's novel.

# DIRECTOR'S NOTE

The ideas of A New Novel came from a place of detachment: after spending a couple of years studying in New York City, I returned to my hometown of Ningbo, China, in the mist of the pandemic, with projects unrealized and life strands broken, although the rhythm of life somehow remained the same before and after. With this feeling, I decided to make a film about New York and also my distancing from it, using the stories I wrote inspired by the two cities. It's a seemingly uneventful film, but within it the fictional text(s) speak of a parallel life. I found there is an interesting connection, spatially and temporally, and through the voice of the text, we bring together stories and feelings from many places and times, forming between them a montage that informs the state of lives and dreams in these twenty-something characters.

This film is made with a skeleton crew, and I thank my first AD, Chuqiao, my camera crew, Xiaoping and Shuyang, my sound crew, Wang Chao and Zihao, for their professionalism and craft during our five-day shooting.

I hoped to create in the film a tiny utopia where we dive into stranger consciousness, away from the usual dynamics that dominate our lives, and I am lucky to have found my cast: Baofeng, a fellow filmmaker and artist; Jianing, whose presence alone speaks of her independence; and Shilo, who works in fashion design and a great enthusiast in the art of divination. This film wouldn't exist without their contributing of ideas, creating a collage of elements, mysteries, fantasies, all relating to the uncertainty of the world.
